Inadvertently, a convict's sentence was lengthened by two years due to miscommunication.

Sidney Hart Jr was held for an additional two months as a result of the administrative error.

On Wednesday, the Court of Appeal ordered Hart's immediate release from custody. In February 2020, Hart pleaded guilty to a series of break-ins and thefts. Hart had already served a year in prison when he entered his plea.

Ayse Rengin Johnson, the magistrate, imposed concurrent

sentences totaling an additional year.

However, the committal warrants sent to the prison incorrectly stated that the sentences were to be served in that order.

Officials at the prison miscalculated Hart's release date due to a word mixup.

Because the warrant stated that the sentences would run consecutively, prison officials assumed he would have to serve three more years beginning in February 2020, and to be released February 2023.

Hart appealed his

sentence because he didn't have a lawyer. The prosecutor admitted to making a mistake and did not object to his appeal.

"It is imperative that magistrates ensure that the warrants that are sent to the prison accurately reflect the sentences that are imposed," said Court of Appeal President Sir Michael Barnett.

If Hart sues, however, the blunder could cost the courts a lot of money.

# NO MR. MINISTER WE DON'T WANT TO LIVE LIKE HAITIANS

BN took note that Minister of Works, Desmond Bannister is asking Bahamians to decide if they want to live in a country like The Bahamas or a country like Haiti where there is "dirt, garbage, shanty towns all over the place". Those are some strong words!!! See, Minister Bannister and Minister of Immigration Elsworth Johnson ram hot over heavy criticisms made because The Bahamas finally got the testicular fortitude and knocked down Shanty Towns built by illegals and those who don't want to go through the proper process to get immigration status in this country.

One of the biggest critics about the government's planned demolitions of houses in The Farm shanty town in Abaco is the United Nations.

"When I saw that, there were two questions I asked myself. The first question is, what is in the best interest of the Bahamian people whose interest I am supposed to represent? And then the other question is, what

are the consequences of me not doing my job?" Bannister said.

"Consequences of me not doing my job is that we could have a spread of E.Coli in Abaco. Water could be contaminated and people could be sick. We could have the constant widespread anarchy in our country where people decide they are gonna go on other people's land and take it over. And I can tell you that complaints in New Providence and elsewhere have increased.

"I have a number of complaints from Bahamians who are saying that when they go to their property now they are meeting shanty houses. We are going to have to conduct an exercise in New Providence because of that, very soon.

"It has come to a point where we have to decide whether we are gonna have a society like The Bahamas or we are going to have a society like Haiti and if any of you have been to Haiti, you'd see what happens there - dirt, garbage, shanty towns all over the place. We have to decide if that's what we want and if we (don't)

want that, we have to decide if we are gonna take a stance in the interest of our country."

Bannister also said exercises involving shanty towns in New Providence will be conducted soon, as residents have already complained about illegal structures springing up all over the place.

The UN said the planned evictions and demolitions "violate human rights to adequate housing."

The Supreme Court in 2018 granted an injunction protecting shanty town homes in New Providence from destruction pending an outcome of a judicial review over the matter. Government officials have said homes in The Farm and elsewhere are not subject to that injunction. The Ministry of Works spearheaded the demolition of 45 "incomplete and unoccupied" structures in The Farm in April.

"I'm just carrying out my job based on The Bahamas," Mr Bannister said yesterday. "If those folks want to make a statement about The Bahamas, then I think as a



country, as we are deporting people, if they want them to come to their neighbourhood and put a shanty town in their neighbourhood... that's what you should ask them.

"How would they feel if in their neighbourhood there is a shanty town with faeces going in the ground water with the potential for people to get sick, with all the challenges where you go on your land, and someone is out there

putting up a shanty town house? I'd like you to ask them these questions when they raise these issues about The Bahamas because we're just trying to live in law and order and we're just trying to protect the welfare of Bahamians."



## BONGIE OF THE DAY IS AWARDED TO ELON STRIKES AGAIN TWICE IN ONE WEEK!

Elon Tweets and Bitcoin drops! once again! twice in one week! The community is now calling him the crypto killer.

Elon Musk has announced that Tesla has suspended vehicle purchases using bitcoin, resulting in the cryptocurrency crashing.

"Tesla has suspended vehicle purchases using Bitcoin. We are concerned about rapidly increasing use of fossil fuels for Bitcoin mining and transactions, especially

coal, which has the worst emissions of any fuel", the electric car company CEO tweeted. "Cryptocurrency is a good idea on many levels and we believe it has a promising future, but this cannot come at a great cost to the environment.

"Tesla will not be selling any Bitcoin and we intend to use it for transactions as soon as mining transitions to more sustainable energy. We are also looking at other cryptocurrencies that use <1% of Bitcoin's energy/transaction."

Bitcoin fell from a daily high of \$56,000 to around \$49,000 in the immediate aftermath of the Tesla CEO's tweet. The Independent has reached out to Tesla for comment.

The unexpected news comes after Mr Musk has been a prominent advocate for the cryptocurrency throughout the year. In March, the chief executive tweeted in the middle of the night US time: "You can now buy a Tesla with Bitcoin."

He went on to clarify that Tesla would keep the money received as cryptocurrency, rather

than converting it into a fiat currency such as dollars.

"Tesla is using only internal & open source software & operates Bitcoin nodes directly. Bitcoin paid to Tesla will be retained as Bitcoin, not converted to fiat currency," he said in another tweet. "Pay by Bitcoin capability available outside US later this year."




Haiti has had a covid 19 breakout and then a scabies breakout. With their refusal to accept the Astrazeneca free vaccines and


looming uncertainties as to Haiti's handling of the pandemic Health


Mr Davis your false sense of empathy is quite offensive and your desire to play/use the plight of Haitians are insulting and the Creole community should cry shame on you.

## MINISTER TELLS MIGRANTS NOT TO BE AFRAID TO COME FORWARD FOR ASSISTANCE

Residents of Abaco's shantytowns who are expected to be displaced as a result of their homes being demolished can seek help from social services, said Minister of Social Services Frankie Campbell yesterday.

Campbell was responding to questions about the government's position on assisting residents who are on the verge of becoming homeless.

Nearly two years after Hurricane Dorian ravaged Abaco and destroyed the two largest of the island's six shantytowns, many of those residents, some of whom are believed to be undocumented

migrants, are still trying to recover.

Campbell explained that his ministry is the government's "humanitarian" arm, and that whenever a crisis occurs that necessitates humanitarian assistance, the Department of Social Services steps in to meet those needs based on available resources.

There are some emergency situations, he said, that "put aside the entire question of status."

He cited the post-Dorian crisis, claiming that the government's first priority was to save human lives.

"You would appreciate that there would have been no documents available even if there had been an attempt

to separate persons by nationality or status," he said.

"As a result, certain procedures are set aside to save lives based on the urgency of the crisis.

There are different qualifying categories depending on how mild the situation is."

The minister of social services stated that his ministry is not the Department of Immigration and that people should not be afraid to seek emergency help.

"Social service is concerned with an individual's humanitarian needs.

That is what we are concerned about.

Other departments will do their jobs, and I'm sure they won't be hampered, but we have our own," he explained.

He went on to say that the current situation on Abaco is one in which emergency help can be given regardless of someone's status.

"It's a follow-up to Dorian.


It's a continuation of the COVID pandemic, so it's a continuation in that sense."

Desmond Bannister, the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Public Works, has indicated that the government will move forward with its demolition plans, insisting that he has a job to do in eradicating illegal dwellings.

# WOMEN'S RIGHTS ADVOCATE DIES IN JAMAICA AT 67

**D**onna Nicolls, Director of the Bahamas Crisis Centre, died in Jamaica at 67-years-old on Monday past.

Ms. Nicolls, was not only vibrant in her role as deputy director of the centre, but was also a strong advocate for the rights of women here in The Bahamas. She died of stomach cancer.

Ms. Nicolls, a very qualified councilor, recently relocated to her native birthplace of Kingston, Jamaica where she died at home surrounded by loved ones after succumbing to her illness.

The Bahamas Crisis Centre expressed "devastation" over her death, saying Nicolls was a constant presence in that organization.

"We are devastated over the loss of our right hand, Mrs Donna Nicolls," the centre's director, Dr. Sandra Dean-Patterson.

"Not only was she our deputy director and director of all of our training needs, but a dedicated and committed human rights defender and outstanding counselor who, for many years voluntarily counseled survivors of violence on a pro-bono

basis," Dr. Patterson said. "She also had a 50 year career in teaching, counseling and selfless service to others."

Dr. Patterson described Nicolls as passionate, warm and caring. She also said Nicolls was fearless, known for her frankness and unflinching advocacy for the rights of women and children.

"Donna was an amazing human being who gave so much of herself. She will be sorely missed not only by the many volunteers of the Bahamas Crisis Centre but by the country at large and by extension, the Caribbean region," Dr. Patterson added.

In a parting message, Ms. Nicolls reassured her family and friends that she loved, laughed and lived life to the fullest, and she encouraged everyone to never delay living.

Passionate about life and enjoyed every minute of it, she was born in Kingston, Jamaica and would have celebrated her 68th birthday at the end of this month - May 31. She attended Queen's School for Girls in Jamaica and graduated from there in 1969. She also attended the University of the West Indies, Mona Campus. She was married to Teran Nicolls on August 5,



1978.

She is survived by her husband Teran; daughter, Bahamian journalist, human rights advocate and entrepreneur Noelle Nicolls; son, Rande Nicolls and Khalila Duncombe.
